Mrs. Sandra Shroff, Chairman, Managing Committee S.R.I.C.T., chaired the meeting and the following business was transacted.

Planning of Construction of Hostel facilities

SRICT when established in 2011 started with around 200 students largely from Bharuch and Ankleshwar region. Later, as the years rolled on, the number went up to finally become stable around 1200 in 2016. Meanwhile, the name and fame of SRICT spread all over Gujarat attracting students from various parts of the State. Also, the branches like Environmental Science & Technology and Chemical Technology garnered special attention.

It has been quite a natural inquiry by many parents and admission seekers during the admission period, if SRICT is equipped with a hostel, for boys and for girls both. Especially, students from Saurashtra, Mehsana, Valsad, and Vapi regions were found to get dissuaded for non-availability of a hostel facility. Those from regions away from Bharuch and Ankleshwar, although opted for admission to SRICT, had really hard time managing their stay in nearby locations and commuting to college regularly.

In general, professional courses such as Engineering and Medical are always conducted in campuses rigged up with hostels to accommodate many students. Hostels provide not only the accommodation but an experience of sharing and caring fellow colleagues, an opportunity to spend time for studies and research, and a feeling of safety that relieves students and parents both.

Now, SRICT is in the stage when day-to-day academics has been stabilized, research is being fostered, Masters programme has been started, and students and parents are demanding the facility of hostel. Therefore, a proposal of building an accommodation facility equipped with adequate mess and recreation room for 50 boys and 50 girls should not be out of place.
